


Close Calls/Hazards Status 9/99 - 12/99

TERMINOLOGY

RECORDABLE INJURY

- All work-related fatalities are recordable.
- All recognized or diagnosed work-related illnesses are recordable,
- All work-related injuries requiring medical treatment or involving loss of consciousness, restriction of work or motion, or transfer to another job are recordable.

INJURY INCIDENCE RATE (IIR)

- The number of recordable incidents related to a common exposure base of 100 full-time workers. The common exposure base enables one to make accurate inter-industry comparisons, trend analysis over time, or comparisons among firms regardless of size. This rate is calculated as:

$$\mathbf{N/EH \times 200,000}$$

where:

N = number of recordable incidents

EH = total hours worked by all employees during calendar year

200,000 = base for 100 full-time equivalent workers (working 40 hours per week, 50 weeks per year).

LOST WORKDAY CASES

- Cases which involve days away from work or days of restricted work activity, or both.

LOST WORKDAYS

- The number of workdays (consecutive or not) beyond the day of injury or onset of illness, the employee was away from work or limited to restricted work activity because of an occupational injury or illness.

LOST WORKDAY CASE INCIDENCE RATE (LWDIR)

- The number of lost workday cases related to a common exposure base of 100 full-time workers. The common exposure base enables one to make accurate inter-industry comparisons, trend analysis over time, or comparisons among firms regardless of size. This rate is calculated as:

$$N/EH \times 200,000$$


where:

N = number of lost workday cases

EH = total hours worked by all employees during calendar year


200,000 = base for 100 full-time equivalent workers (working 40 hours per week, 50 weeks per year).


LOST WORKDAY INCIDENCE RATE* (LWDIR) FY97-FY00**


RECORDABLE CASES* FY00**
